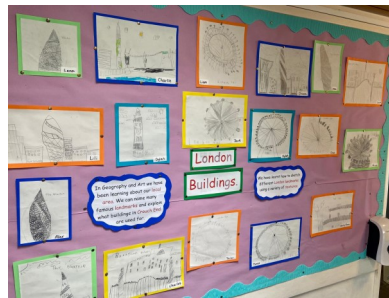

Teacher Highlights



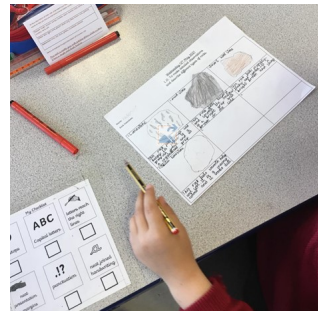

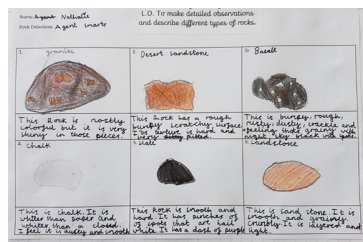
In Year 1 we have been learning how to sketch famous London landmarks using a range of textures and shading.

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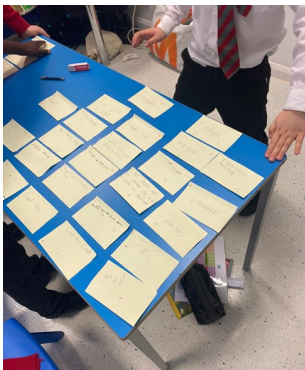
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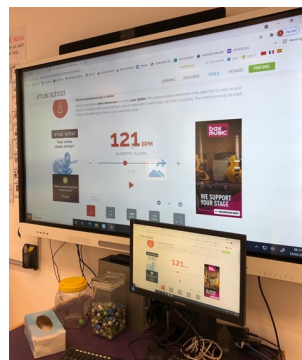
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Teacher Highlights



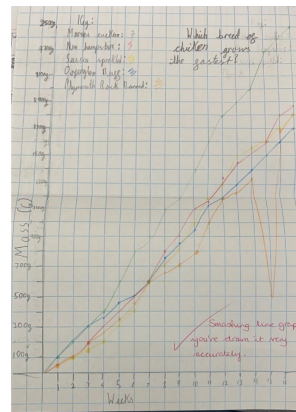
In 4S we created collaborative poems using the thoughts and feelings of our book's main character, Edward Tulane, as he encountered some domestic drama in his life!



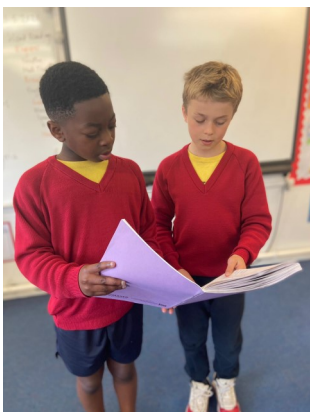
In 4P this week we had a fabulous music lesson with Mr Desmond. He said that the class have a uniquely impressive grasp for rhythm and enthusiasm to match!



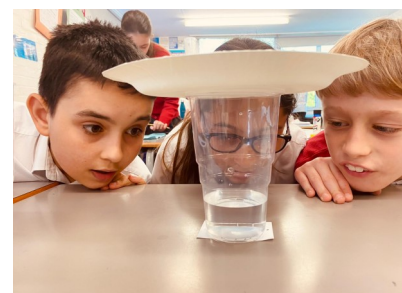
In 5F we welcomed some new additions to the class - ladybirds. We will be watching how these ladybirds develop step by step from eggs to adults.
