Please make sure that all items of uniform including coats and shoes are labelled, it makes it much easier for lost property to be reunited with its owner.





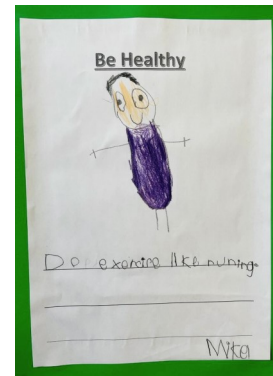
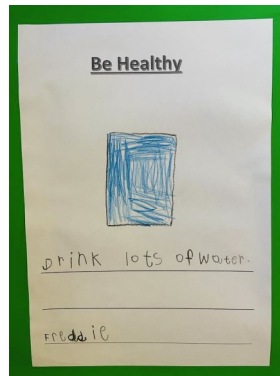
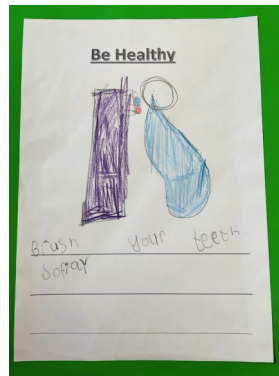
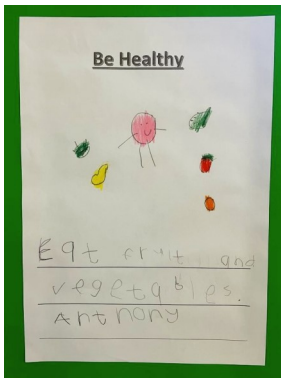
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Chestnut class have been learning about how to be healthy. We made 'How to be healthy' posters and displayed them in our lunch hall for everyone to see as they line up for lunch!

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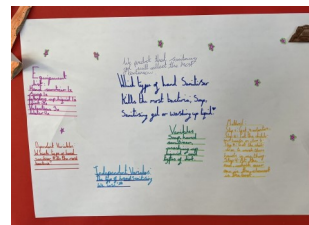
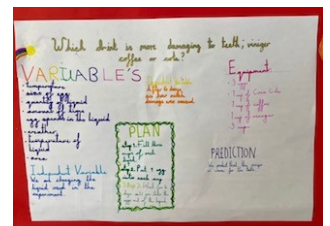


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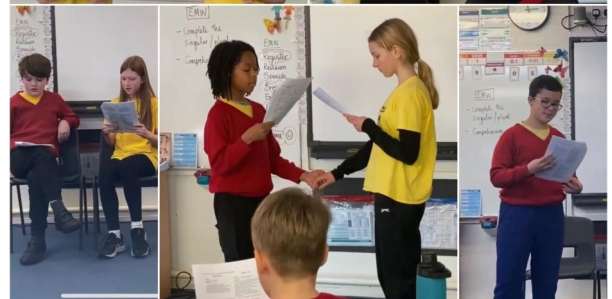
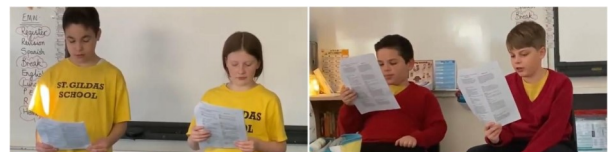
5A: In RE we were thinking about Jesus' sacrifice in the Eucharist and then made our own oil pastel artwork.
