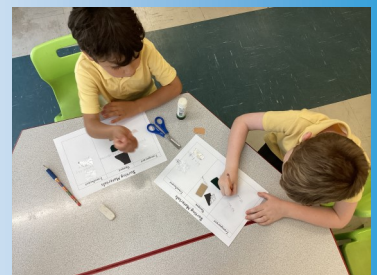
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This week's highlights...

3P have worked so hard on their presentations about volcanoes. They have shared lots of knowledge and facts and have created amazing models.



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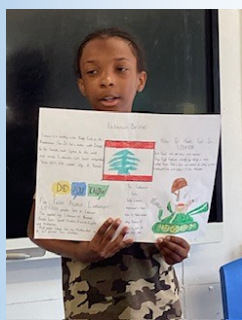
This week's highlights...

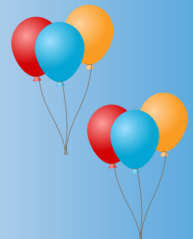
