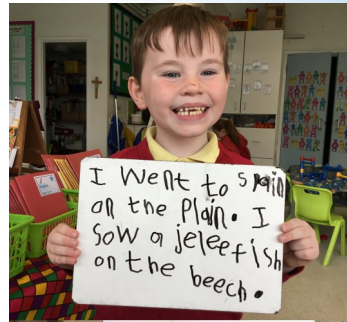
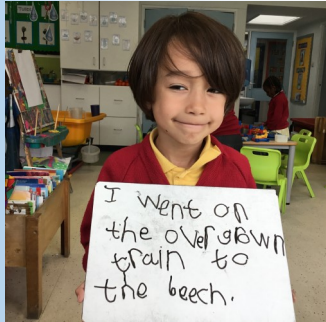
Part of the Crouch End Festival is on Saturday 8th July. Lots of activities. All free.

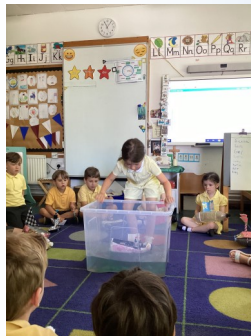

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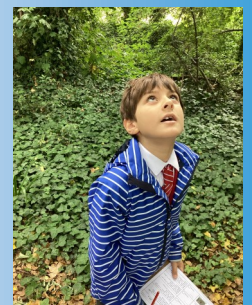
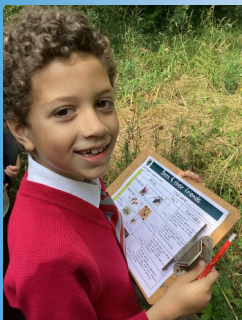
Chestnut class have been using their phonics to write some super sentences about journeys on vehicles that they have made.



Beech class made boats over the weekend as homework. We tested our engineering skills by checking if they all float. Let's sail through with success to Year 2.



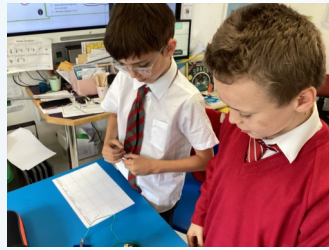
Ash Class have been busy rehearsing their end of term play, The Pied Piper.



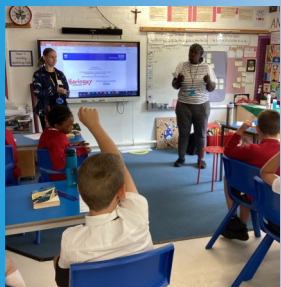
3P had a great time at Railway Fields. We looked for bees and different plants and played lots of games.

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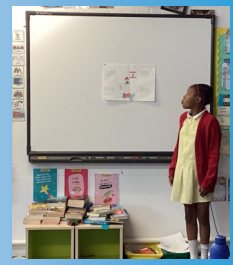
