Year 2 have been very busy doing lots of work inspired by the book 'Dear Daddy'. Come and see their stories, letters and art work which are displayed in the classroom.










Year 3 have been working together on creating a sequence of movements together.

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
















Well done to both the boys and girls football teams who gave it their best shot. Fantastic teamwork and comradery, unfortunately the penalty shoot out went against us!
