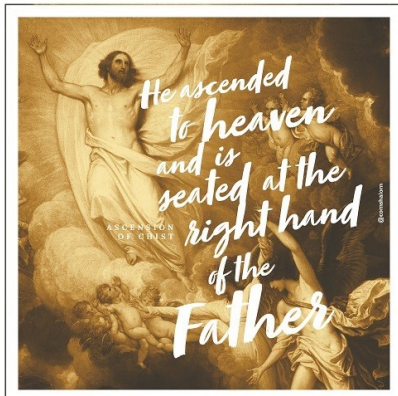

This should be a short statement about this particular artwork and what inspired you to make it. It should be no more than 80 words.

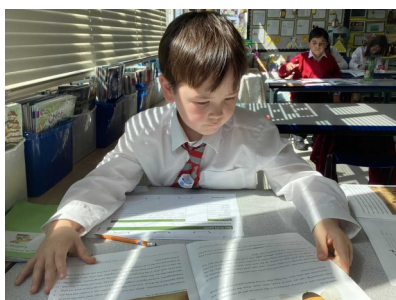

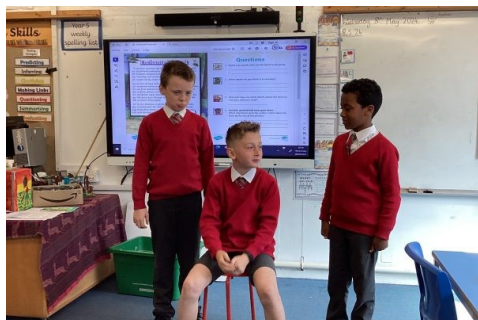
Year 2 have been learning to sing the song 'Living in the Stone Age' about the dangers of life in pre-historic times.
