Everyone did a fantastic job and the plants look great in their colourful pots!

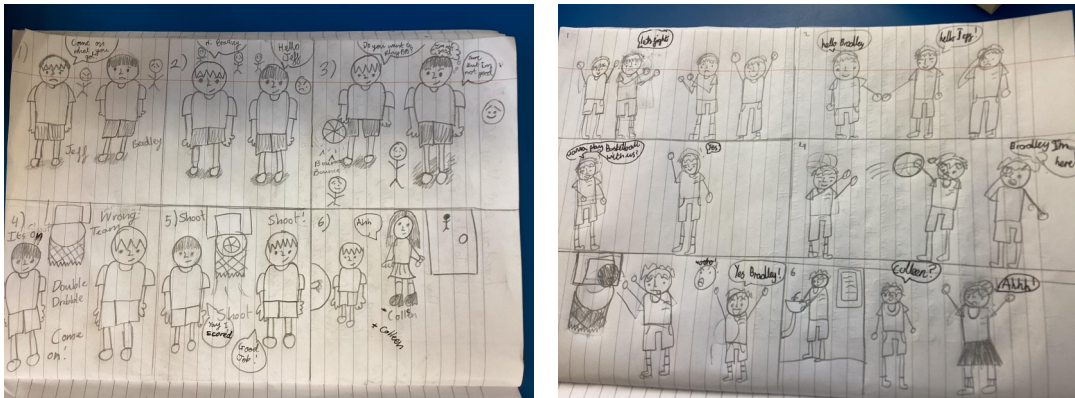


Year 4 did an amazing job this week with their maths assessment on decimals. Everyone tried so hard and did a fantastic job!
